



There is a clear cause for concern process that our partnered University follows with all learners





FAQs



What will I get paid?

You will be paid a minimum of an Unqualified 1 Teacher PayScale depending on your school's location. The minimum salary is £21,731 – £27,252 while you train to teach. Once qualified teachers in their first year of teaching earn £31,650 – £38,766 depending on the schools location.

How much training will I receive?

You will get the most comprehensive training including learning the knowledge, skills and behaviours required to become a teacher. This will be delivered by The University of Buckingham who is the largest provider of teacher training apprenticeships in the United Kingdom

Will I be teaching from Day 1?

Yes, but on a reduced timetable. You must teach minimum of 15 hours per week however while on programme you are only permitted to teach a maximum of a 70% timetable. The remaining 30% of your week will be compromised of Planning, Preparation and Assessment (PPA), virtual university lectures, virtual university tutor meetings, schools mentor meetings, reading, research, gathering evidence, and observing outstanding practice.

FAQs

How successful am I likely to be?

There was a 100% success rate in the latest cohort and 100% were employed at the completion of programme.

What is the cost to me of the training?

There is no cost to you for the training. This is fully funded by the Apprenticeship Levy that schools pay into every year.

What are my salary expectations after completing my training?

Salaries for early career teacher are growing fast. For September 2025 there was a 5.5% pay increase meaning that first year qualified teachers will be paid between £31,650 and £38,776 depending on your school location.
